'MUMMY! He's not breathing!'

Imagine blissfully relaxing beside a resort pool without a care in the world – only to be jolted awake by those frightful words.

Then suddenly, reality hits as you watch a small, limp body being pulled from the water.

Dead or alive. You don't know.

This was the sickening thought haunting Tracey's mind as she looked up in disbelief.

The last thing she then expected to see was her own daughter, 8-year old Mia, in control of the scene. Calling for help and attending to the child – all while remaining calm and composed.

These were the events that took place at a Port Douglas resort in September 2015 when 4-year old Ethan slipped on the pool step and knocked his head. Seconds later he was unconscious, submerged in water, without a sound.

But luckily, one girl noticed. And luckily for Ethan, that girl was his new buddy, Mia.

Mia completed the St John **First Aid in Schools** Program at her local primary school in the inner suburbs of Melbourne in May 2015. And according to her mum, that was the reason Mia responded so competently that day.

"Mia held Ethan tightly as he continued to slip from her arms. When the ambulance arrived, Ethan slowly regained consciousness while Mia stood over him repeating questions she learnt at school, such as 'What's your name?', 'What day is it?' and 'How many fingers do I have up?'" recalled Tracey.

After the paramedics attended to Ethan, they confirmed he would make a full recovery – praising Mia for her quick thinking and life-saving actions.

The St John First Aid in Schools Program plays a vital role in our community.

Launched in 2012, the St John First Aid in Schools Program is designed to educate children on how to assist in emergencies, whether at home, at school or on the sports field.
